COVID 19

We would like to reassure guests that we are taking additional precautions to minimise risks and protect our guests, staff and the local community, and we encourage you to follow the current guidance from Health Protection Scotland to prevent the spread of infection:

Amongst other things we are -

- Using an Electrostatic fogger to sanitise all rooms, bathrooms, soft furnishings, furniture, drawers, wardrobes, the restaurant, kitchen and corridors. The sanitiser used has been tested to ensure that it kills all viruses and especially COVID 19. The sanitiser lasts for 30 days, and we “fog” each area every 4 weeks.
- Undertaking daily cleaning, disinfecting and sanitising of frequently touched objects and surfaces such as light switches, door handles, tea and coffee making facilities, condiments, telephones, keyboards, card machines etc.
- Ensuring that all staff practice thorough hand washing (as always) – for at least 20 seconds and frequently throughout the day.
- All our crockery, cutlery pots and pans are cleaned and sanitised in a commercial dishwasher.
- Ensuring staff isolate if they are showing any symptoms.
- Our laundry supplier is washing all laundry and towels in accordance with NHS infection control guidelines for a healthcare environment which incorporates washing at a higher temperature and increasing the chemical dosing.

Our guests are kindly asked to

- Sanitise their hands upon arrival at the hotel and before entering the restaurant. Hand sanitiser stations have been set up.
- Ensure thorough hand washing practice is adhered to.
- Advise us immediately should you begin to display symptoms relating to the virus.
- Maintain social distancing at all times – our premises have narrow hallways, so it may mean that you have to back track to let other guests through, please be courteous to each other in these unprecedented times.

Please follow current guidance and advise us should you begin to display any symptoms relating to the virus.

To make your stay with us as comfortable and safe as possible, we would be grateful if you could take a few minutes to review this information.

THE SHIP INN HISTORY

The Ship Inn has been a hostelry since 1794. Renamed The Anwoth Hotel in 1908, it remained so until 2005 when our predecessors Jim and Helen Stewart sympathetically renovated the hotel and returned it to its original name.

One of the most famous residents at the Inn was Dorothy Sayers, who wrote the novel 'Five Red Herrings' while staying here on holiday. Gatehouse of Fleet and the surrounding area provide the backdrop for her classic whodunit mystery, and guests can trace many of the novel's settings within the local area. The town has also been used as a location for a number of films, including the cult classic *The Wickerman*.

Back in 1794, when the Ship Inn first opened its doors, Gatehouse of Fleet was a bustling harbour town with four cotton mills as well as a brewery, soap factory, tannery, brickworks and brass foundry. Up to 150 ships used the town's harbour, Port Macadam, and the town was even known for a while as the Glasgow of the South. The town's population at that time was double what it is now, and the Ship Inn was one of two hostelries in the village.

Over time the industries closed and the population shrank, and nowadays Gatehouse of Fleet is a very picturesque, quiet village. The Mill on the Fleet is the only remaining mill, and this historic building is now a visitor centre housing very informative displays about the local area and its history.

LOCAL HISTORY

Gatehouse of Fleet itself only dates back to the mid-1700s. Initially just a staging post on the route to Ireland, the town developed after the entrepreneur James Murray of Broughton built his mansion, Cally House, in 1765. However, there is evidence that the area has been inhabited since prehistoric times, with the sites at Cairnholy and Trusty's Hill Fort providing fascinating glimpses into the past. The Pictish stone carvings known as the De'il's Specs (Devil's Spectacles) at Trusty's Hill Fort are particularly unusual in this part of Scotland and well worth a look.

Also in the local area are Cardoness Castle, the 15th century, six storey tower house of the McCullochs, and the roofless old kirk at Anwoth. Cardoness Castle is remarkably well preserved, and visitors are able to climb the narrow staircase within the tower.

The views out over the Fleet Bay from the battlements are well worth the climb. Anwoth Kirk is also worth visiting. Dating from the 12th century, the kirk sits in a peaceful spot and has some fascinating tomb stones.

Fans of The Wickerman will recognise the kirk from some of the most iconic scenes in the film, and the schoolhouse from the film also sits close by.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

IN THE EVENT OF THE FIRE ALARM SOUNDING

In the event of the fire alarm sounding (a two-tone siren) please evacuate the building as quickly and calmly as possible using the nearest fire exit, to the fire assembly point which is in the Anwoth Beer Garden opposite the hotel. Please close all doors behind you. Do not stop to pick up belongings. Do not re-enter the building until authorised to do so. Please familiarise yourself with your means of escape which is on the back of your bedroom door.

If you have any hearing or sight problems, mobility difficulties or issues which may make it difficult to evacuate the building in the event of an emergency, please notify us upon arrival so that we can assist you.

Please be assured that your personal information remains secure and at no point will we give your details to any third party.

SMOKING

You are respectfully reminded that The Ship Inn is a non-smoking establishment and we request that you refrain from smoking whilst inside.

You may smoke outside or in the Anwoth Beer Garden but please dispose of your cigarette ends responsibly using the sand bucket provided.

If you are found to have been smoking in your room, we will levy a deep cleaning charge equivalent to one night's accommodation.

FIRST AID KIT

The first aid kit is situated behind reception. Please ask if you need to use this.

PARKING & ACCESS TO MAIN ROAD

Please park outside the hotel, the parking is free outside the hotel to the front and side of the building.

ACCESS TO THE SHIP INN

Upon arrival you will be given a room card, please keep this safe and away from other credit cards and mobile phones, as these could blank your card. Please keep your card safe and take it with you. We do not lock the front downstairs door.

You are welcome to come and go as you please but if arriving late we do ask you to keep the noise down out of respect for other guests. Please note that the lights in the halls and landing are on sensors so will come on as you move through the building.

BREAKFAST

Due to Covid 19 restrictions we ask that all guests pre-book a 30 minute time slot for breakfast and pre-order your breakfast the night before. This is to ensure that we comply with The Scottish Government guidelines to maintain social distancing at all times.

The dining room is located through the door from reception, upon entering please use the Hand sanitiser gel.

While every effort has been made to reduce the impact of noise travelling, this is an old building and inevitability there will still be some. As guests come to relax at The Ship Inn, we respectfully request that you do not play music or use the television on a high volume especially after 10.00pm.

HEATING

The radiators in your room do have thermostats so you can adjust them according to how warm you like your room. The hot water supply to the rooms is continuous.

If you have any difficulty connecting, please let us know. We do have highspeed fibre optic lines but this is an old building with very thick walls. We will however do our best to boost the signal to your room.

TELEPHONE

We do not make a charge as only local and national calls are permitted.

NEWSPAPERS

Gatehouse offers a couple of newsagents should you fancy the 5-minute walk over the bridge to The Gatehouse Store or Spar.

LIGHTS & ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

Some of the lights in the corridors at The Ship Inn are automatic so will come on as you walk past. The electricity will only come on in your room when you have put your room key into the holder, which is just inside the room door.

FORGOTTEN ANYTHING?

Shaving kits, tooth brushes, sanitary products and basic painkillers can be purchased from the local shops.

If guest property is found after departure, we will endeavour to contact you. If you would like your items returning, we are happy to send them back to you. We simply ask for the postage and a £1.50 handling fee. Unclaimed items will be disposed of after 14 days.

EN-SUITE INFORMATION

TOWELS

Please help us maintain our commitment to being environmentally friendly, by using the following system to prevent the unnecessary washing of towels:

If you leave your towels in the bath/shower, we will gladly change them
If you leave your towels on the rail, you are happy to re-use them

DRESSING GOWNS

If you wish to have a dressing gown, please ask at reception, we have removed them from the rooms due to COVID 19.

TOILET

The Ship Inn respectfully asks that only toilet paper is flushed down the toilet. All other items should be placed in a sanitary disposal bag before depositing in the bathroom bin (which we empty daily). Spare toilet rolls are in the drawer underneath the sink.

SHOWERS

The showers are fed directly from the mains water supply and so can be easily controlled by the user. To turn the rain shower head on, turn the top knob. For the temperature, turn the bottom knob (press the safety button for hotter water).

Our shower trays are designed to be anti-slip. If you prefer a rubber suction mat, please come to reception and we will provide you with one. You are reminded to make sure the mat is stuck to the shower tray before getting in to avoid slipping. The flooring in the en-suites, although tiled, is also non-slip however we do recommend you use the towelled bath mat provided.

Please use the towel rail in your en-suite to keep your towels aired.

Anti-slip bathmats are available on request.

SHOWER GEL / SHAMPOO BOTTLES

In line with our environmental policy, we have chosen to use larger, refillable bottles of shower gel, hand lotion, and shampoo. We hope you enjoy using these luxury products.

ATTRACTIONS

VISITOR ATTRACTIONS

We have a great selection of visitor attractions on our door step. If you have any queries or would like more information on anything you have seen in the visitors attraction book in your room or from the additional information below, please come to reception and we will be more than happy to help and recommend.

WALKING

Galloway is a walkers paradise, with walks suitable for all ages and abilities. Around Gatehouse of Fleet there are some beautiful woodland walks, including Cally Woods and Carstramon Wood. Glorious displays of snowdrops are followed by carpets of bluebells in spring, and the woods come alive with wildlife including red squirrels, roe deer, buzzards and tree creepers. You will encounter ancient coppiced woodland around the Doon of Castramont, and the remains of the 12th century Cally Motte and the 18th century Temple Folly in the Cally Woods.

Slightly further afield you can find wonderful coastal paths, as well as numerous trails through the Galloway Forest Park. There are also hill climbs such as Cairnsmore of Fleet and the more challenging Merrick, both of which provide stunning views across the landscape.

CYCLING

With the creation of the 7 Stanes mountain bike trails, Galloway has become something of a mecca for cyclists, but there's more to it than just white knuckle rides. GARDENS

Galloway has a particularly mild climate thanks to the Gulf Stream which carries warm air from the Gulf of Mexico to our shores. This warm air allows the cultivation of plants that you would never normally associate with Scotland.

Logan Botanic Garden is not to be missed for its spectacular display of exotic southern-hemisphere plants, palm trees and the wonderful woodland garden. Nearby Logan House Garden is also worth a visit with its ancient shrubberies and avenue of monkey puzzle trees.

In the opposite direction is the National Trust for Scotland owned Threave Gardens, just outside Castle Douglas. This vast garden is home to the National Trust for Scotland's School for Heritage Gardening and features formal and woodland gardens, water features, a secret garden, glasshouses and a working walled garden to name just a few. You can easily lose a day in this wonderful garden!

FAMILY ATTRACTIONS

There are some great attractions for families within easy reach of the Ship Inn.

Cocoabean Company is a chocolate factory that runs chocolate making workshops, as well as having a fantastic indoor and outdoor play area, and is less than 5 miles from the Ship Inn.

Also just 5 miles away is Cream O' Galloway, an organic farm producing ice cream and cheese. As well as farm tours and ice cream tasting sessions there is a wooden adventure playground, pedal karts, flying fox and an indoor pirate themed soft play area.

Mabie Farm is another great day out for the family (and close to the 7 Stanes trails at Mabie). With a great variety of farm animals to pat and feed as well as loads of indoor and outdoor activities, you can easily fill a day here.

BEACHES

The Solway Coast has numerous clean and safe sandy beaches as well as some great rocky coves for rock pooling. The following are some of our favourites.

Mossyard

Just 3 miles from the Ship Inn to the west is Mossyard, which boasts three sandy beaches. Phone: (01557) 840226 or visit www.mossyard.co.uk. There is a parking charge.

Cardoness Shore

Also to the west of Gatehouse is Cardoness shore. There are six sandy bays at Cardoness, although some are only accessible at high tide to those living in the caravans or chalets there. There are two principle entries:

- By parking at the large lay-by near the Skyreburn Café, and walking along the shore. This is generally only possible when the tide is a quarter out.
- Driving into the Cardoness estate, and buying a day ticket at the estate office. The Cardoness Estate car park gives easy access to the main bay.

From the Estate car park, dinghies can be launched from trailers. There are also public toilets available at Cardoness Shore. Phone: (01557) 840288.

Sandgreen Bay

On the east side of the Big Water of Fleet estuary lies Sandgreen, a wide bay backed by a large caravan site. The bay is divided by buoys into sections for motor boats, sailing boats and wind surfers, and for swimming. Parking and toilets are available at Sandgreen. There is a parking charge, but if you have bikes, you can cycle the 4 miles to the beach through Cally Woods.

Carrick Bay

Carrick is another fine sandy bay, backed by chalets, with a rather stoney bay on each side of it. It has exceptionally easy access for launching dinghies, surf-boards, canoes, and so on. It also has free parking.

GOLFING

There are many beautiful 9 and 18 hole courses within easy reach of the Inn, including the 9 hole course at Gatehouse, which has lovely views over Wigtown bay. The championship courses at Turnberry, Ayr, Prestwick and Troon are also all within driving distance.

ANCIENT SITES

The area is steeped in history and guests have a myriad selection of ancient sites to choose from.

There are stone circles and chambered cairns, of which Cairn Holy's Neolithic chambered cairns and Torhouse Stone Circle are fine examples.

You can also visit the cradle of Christianity in Whithorn, where you will find the oldest Christian church in Scotland, Whithorn Priory, founded by St Ninian in 390 AD. Close by is St Ninian's cave, which is believed to have been used by St Ninian as a retreat.

There are also abbeys rich in folklore, such as Sweetheart Abbey, which was founded by Lady Dervorgilla of Galloway in 1273 in memory of her husband Lord John Balliol. Lady Dervorgilla was heartbroken when her husband died, and had his heart embalmed and placed in an ivory casket, which she carried with her everywhere she went. When she died in 1289 she was laid to rest in the abbey, with her husband's heart clasped to her chest.

There are also numerous ancient castles to visit: Cardoness, Threave, Caerlaverock and Drumlanrig to name a few.

GALLOWAY FORREST PARK

Galloway Forest Park is the largest forest park in Britain, covering over 300 square miles, and is teeming with wildlife. It includes a red deer range, a wild goat park and red squirrel feeding stations. There are numerous walking and cycling trails in the park, as well as forest drives.

It is also the only Dark Sky Park in the UK. Light pollution in the forest park is extremely low, which means that over 7000 stars are visible with the naked eye, and the Milky Way is clearly visible.

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

To continue our commitment to reduce our environmental impact as a business we are minimising our plastic waste by removing free plastic bottles of water in our rooms.

We now provide free mineral water from our dispenser in the hallway outside Room 3. The dispenser provides water at either a cold (blue tab) or ambient (white tab) temperature. Please use the glasses from your room or the recyclable cups at the water dispenser to help yourself to water.

As a business we are very aware of our footprint upon the environment and are striving to reduce this. Whilst not exhaustive here are some of the changes we have implemented;

- Using low energy lightbulbs in all areas of the hotel – moving to LED's soon
- Source locally produced food
- Our electricity supply is powered through 100% renewable energy sources
- We use refillable toiletries in our bathrooms and toilets
- We collect rain water to re-use for the window boxes
- Our cooking oil is recycled

- Using an Electrostatic fogger to sanitise all rooms, bathrooms, soft furnishings, furniture, drawers, wardrobes, the restaurant, kitchen and corridors. The sanitiser used has been tested to ensure that it kills all viruses and especially COVID 19. The sanitiser lasts for 30 days, and we “fog” each area every 4 weeks.
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- Ensuring that all staff practice thorough hand washing (as always) – for at least 20 seconds and frequently throughout the day.
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Our guests are kindly asked to

- Sanitise their hands upon arrival at the hotel and before entering the restaurant. Hand sanitiser stations have been set up.
- Ensure thorough hand washing practice is adhered to.
- Advise us immediately should you begin to display symptoms relating to the virus.
- Maintain social distancing at all times – our premises have narrow hallways, so it may mean that you have to back track to let other guests through, please be courteous to each other in these unprecedented times.
